480-27-.01(j) Definitions.

For purposes of these Rules and Regulations, the following definitions apply:

(j) Electronic Signature. An ~~electronic~~ electronically reproduced visual image signature or an electronic data signature of a practitioner, which appears on, is attached to or is logically associated with an electronic prescription drug order.

Authority O.C.G.A. Secs.

480-27-.02(2)(a), (b), and (c) and 480-27-.02(4) Prescription Drug Order Requirements.

(2) Electronically transmitted prescription drug orders shall contain all information required for written prescriptions above and required by state and federal law including the prescriber's name, address, and phone number, except the signature may be an electronic signature and the electronically transmitted prescription must include the time and date of transmission.. Such electronically transmitted prescription may not be for controlled substances except as may be allowed by federal law.

(a) Electronically transmitted prescription drug orders transmitted from the practitioner and received by a pharmacy via facsimile must contain either an electronically reproduced visual image signature or original signature of the practitioner.

(b) Electronically generated prescription drug orders transmitted from the practitioner and received by a pharmacy as e-mails must contain an electronic data signature of the practitioner.

(c) All electronic prescription drug orders generated by a practitioner containing an electronically reproduced visual image signature or an electronic data signature must bear wording that appears on the face of the prescription which indicates the signature was electronically generated.

(3) The pharmacist shall exercise professional judgment regarding the accuracy and authenticity of prescriptions consistent with federal and state statutes and regulations. In the absence of unusual circumstances requiring further inquiry, the pharmacy and each of its associated pharmacists is entitled to rely on the accuracy and authenticity of electronically transmitted prescriptions from an intervening electronic formatter that comply with this rule.

(4) ~~Electronically generated prescriptions containing an electronically reproduced signature of a practitioner that is presented, as a prescription order to the patient shall be printed on security paper.~~ Electronically generated prescription drug orders presented to a patient by a practitioner must contain an electronically reproduced visual image signature of a practitioner, contain working which indicates the signature was electronically generated, and printed on security paper.

Authority O.C.G.A. Secs.

480-27-.04(b)(6) and (7) Use of Facsimile Machine or Other Electronic Means to Transmit or Receive Prescription Drug Orders.

(b) Prescription drug orders transmitted by facsimile or other electronic means shall include:

1. In the case of a prescription drug order for a dangerous drug, the complete name, address and telephone number of the prescribing practitioner;
2. In the case of a prescription drug order for a controlled substance when authorized by federal law, the complete name, address, telephone number, and DEA registration number of the prescribing practitioner;
3. The complete name and address of the patient;
4. The time and date of transmission,
5. The complete name of the person transmitting the prescription drug order and a telephone number for verbal confirmation, and
6. The NPI for the prescriber as assigned under federal law, and

(7) An electronically reproduced visual image signature or original signature of the practitioner.

Bill Atkins, Director, Georgia Drugs and Narcotics Agency Report:

- Reported that the 2008 drug update passed during the 2008 session.
- Reported on the direct administration of flu vaccines by Pharmacists. Board voted to post information from GDNA on this topic to the board's website.

Anita O. Martin, Executive Director's Report:

- The Board advised that Veterinarians issuing prescription drug orders must possess NPI numbers.
- The Board approved May 16, 2008 as the application deadline for the June 2008 examinations. Voted to have this deadline and instructions posted to the web-site that applications must be received by this date in order for applicants to be considered to sit for the June examination. However, until application files are complete with final transcripts and passing exam score-individuals will not be considered for licensure.
- Board requested that the "black notebook" treatment/evaluation facility application have a requirement added that to be considered for board approval – they agree to report all admissions into their programs to the board.
