PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

To my colleagues,

It is a privilege to serve on the Board that oversees our profession. It is an even greater privilege to have the opportunity to serve as the Board's President this year.

As Board members we are appointed by the Governor to protect, promote, and preserve the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Georgia. Reflecting on that charge, ensuring the most appropriate balance between the acts of protecting, promoting, and preserving (what I will collectively refer to as advocating for patient care) is of greatest importance to me.

I not only have a desire to ensure there are appropriate guardrails within our rules which protect the safety and welfare of Georgia patients from harm, whether intentional or unintentional, but I also have a desire to promote and

preserve the public health through innovation by minimizing and eliminating unnecessary barriers to the practice of pharmacy and the business of pharmacy. To the extent possible, within the confines of the laws in Georgia, it is my desire for this Board to create, modify and in some cases even eliminate rules with the goal of enhancing pharmacists' ability to advocate (protect, promote, and preserve) for patient care in all settings. By focusing too heavily on any one of those three charges of patient care advocacy, we run the risk of doing an injustice to the citizens of Georgia.

Finally, I want to encourage all pharmacists in Georgia to hold this and future Boards accountable to the spirit of this charge and the healthy balance it attests to. When I first became a licensed pharmacist in 2002, I had no desire to be involved in pharmacy-based associations, the regulatory affairs of the profession and certainly not to serve on the Board of Pharmacy. Over time, as I progressed in my career, I became more passionate about my desire to advocate for patient care through the practice of pharmacy. I quickly learned that the only way to encourage change and progress is to be involved, build relationships, and always have the patient's best interest in mind. It is my hope that each of you will find ways to exhibit your passion for patient care through pharmacy by being involved and shaping the future of our profession.

GEORGIA DRUGS AND NARCOTICS AGENCY UPDATE

It is the Mission of the Georgia Drugs and Narcotics Agency (GDNA) to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public by ensuring all laws pertaining to pharmacy, dangerous drugs, and controlled substances are followed by both registrants and any others who handle or possess pharmaceuticals. As the enforcement arm of the Georgia Board of Pharmacy, our agents inspect every licensed pharmacy in the State of Georgia. Agents conduct investigations of these pharmacies related to public complaints and administrative issues. Agents also conduct criminal investigations regarding prescription drug abuse throughout the state which may or may not involve licensed pharmacies.

The State of Georgia, along with most other states, is in the middle of a long, entrenched fight against opioid abuse. GDNA is an agency directly involved in this fight by ensuring Pharmacy Board registrants and other healthcare entities adhere to the laws, rules, and regulations relating to the appropriate dispensing and distributing of opioid prescription medication. Along with the Pharmacy Board, GDNA is proud to be of service to the citizens of Georgia.
